


The original owner of the Sacred Heart of Jesus Shrine was St. Procop Parish (previously located at 3181 West 41st Street in Cleveland). St. Procop Parish was established in 1872 to serve the Bohemian people who relocated or emigrated to the city. The most current St. Procop Church building was dedicated in 1903.

We are so blessed to have this shrine on our campus as we remember the people of St. Procop who were inspired by the Sacred Heart of Jesus Shrine for over 100 years.





The Victor E. Buehrle, Jr. Science Wing

Ten years ago Victor Buehrle transformed a wing of the junior high by making a donation to the St. Sebastian Parish Foundation — a donation that continues to make a daily impact on the students at St. Sebastian Parish School.

The Buehrle family has deep ties to St. Sebastian Parish. Victor's wife, Kathleen, is a life-long member, having been raised in the parish by her parents Charles and Kathryn Beringer. Victor and Kathleen were married at St. Sebastian by Monsignor Zwisler on July 30, 1955. Victor, who passed away in 1999, was a church member for 35 years and was an usher for most of those years.

Five of the Buehrle's six children attended St. Sebastian Parish School: Kathryn, Rosemary, twins Julie & Jeannie and Terese. Edward, the youngest, did not attend St. Sebastian because the family moved.

As Kathleen tells it, her husband decided he wanted to do something special for his beloved parish. In 1997, Victor made an appointment to talk about it with former pastor Fr. William Karg. While they were kicking around ideas for a donation, a student walked by. Fr. Karg told Victor that the young man wanted to study Chemistry in college.

Victor, who credited his success in business to the Chemistry degree he earned from Kent State University, asked what it would take to give that student an early start. Fr. Karg suggested a state-of-the-art science lab. And the rest, as they say, is history.

The Victor E. Buehrle science wing was dedicated in 1999, at a ceremony officiated by Bishop Anthony Pilla. Our state-of-the-art science lab/classroom features real life scientific equipment, lab sinks, interactive computer stations, a SMART board, plenty of storage, desks and more. According to science teacher

Betty Indriolo, who has taught at St. Sebastian Parish School for ten years, students in grades 7 and 8 use the well-equipped classroom/lab every day.

"The classroom/lab environment allows for an easy transition from traditional lecture lessons to hands-on lab activities to reinforce a particular science topic while remaining in the same classroom," says Indriolo, "All students have slightly different ways of learning; lab work is especially helpful for kinesthetic learners."

While the lab is located in the junior high wing, other students use the lab too. Favorite activities include the experiments that Kindergarten and I st grade students complete with their 7th or 8th grade "science buddies," says Indriolo.

Indriolo is especially proud of that all six computers in the lab are accessorized with a Vernier data collection system that allows students to collect real-time measurement data (temperature, pressure, velocity, conductivity). When students use this system, they are using equipment just like professional scientists.

"The parish of St. Sebastian is a vibrant and active parish where community, faith, and action meet every single day, all day. The parish has been historically and richly the cornerstone of West Akron and gem of the Diocese of Cleveland and continues to be so today. In order to keep the parish alive and active we need a plan for the future. Sufficient for the day is its own sin, as Scripture says. Here are some of the major blessings and challenges of the parish that lie outside of the day-to-day operations of the parish and thus need special attention".

Here is a brief list of our needs that need tended (Father's complete report can be found at foundation.stsebastian.org)

ROOFS

Most of the flat roofs on the buildings of the main part of our grounds are ten-year roofs. Through careful attention and maintenance, we have made them last approximately 15 years. The flat roof on Byrider Hall is about five years old. These foam roofs have served us well but they will not last forever and their removal and replacement will be very expensive.

CHURCH BRASS

The most important activity of any parish is its worship of God particularly through the celebration of the Eucharist. St. Sebastian is fortunate to have quality materials with which to work in aiding us in our prayer. Our candle sticks, tabernacle, sanctuary lights, ambos and such are well suited to the style of the building and have serveds us wonderfully for over 50 years. Each piece is intact owing to the original quality, however being 50 years old, they have lost their luster. The brass has become dull, scratched and wom. Our tabernacle is now kept permanently covered due to its worn appearance and one door needs replaced. A parishioner has generously replated many pieces, and more needs done. Your help will be a blessing to helping us preserve these parish treasures.

PEWS AND TERRAZO

The pews are the most used and touched objects by most people in the Church. We use them to sit, kneel, and hold books and personal objects. We set our children on them and place our hands on the back rests of the pews in front of us when standing. Simply because they take up a huge amount of the floor space the condition of pews

reflects the overall feel of the cleanliness and physical state of the church building. To this extent we can be proud of the original craftsmanship of our pews. In style and construction they are befitting our parish building. The pews have been in use for over 50 years and are showing signs of wear both in their finish and in their structure. The finish is wearing, scratched, and unsanitary looking so that even when clean they look distracting. On a weekly basis kneelers that have fallen off need to be repaired. The pews need to be repaired, refinished, and have book racks added to them and at the same time the terrazzo floor would be restored filling pitted areas and restoring the original luster.

CHURCH PLAZA

The church plaza is our front door to the community and creates the first impression to a person attending our parish. It is also the "front yard" of the parish so to speak. The church plaza is important to us both for the aesthetics of our property both to the parish and the greater community and for the usefulness of gathering, especially in the summer for events like Donut Sunday. The 50+ year concrete is starting to deteriorate. The concrete wall surrounding the garden is starting to give way and concrete pads are cracking. There is an issue of safety as well as aesthetics. \$20,000 will allow us to remove and replace the existing concrete as well as put in aesthetically beautiful brick seating walls.

CHURCH AND SCHOOL **EXTERIOR DOORS**

Like our pews, our doors are handled by just about every person in the parish. Whether it be coming to worship, attending school or PSR and any of the many events we enjoy, everyone comes in contact with our doors. Their condition say something about the health of the parish. On the one hand it is nice knowing they are so heavily used they need repaired, but if we want to continue welcoming people into our buildings and ministries they will need repaired and replaced. We have stopped using salt as a deicer in hopes of preserving our doors better and we make as many repairs as we can. Yet, many doors will need to be replaced not only for aesthetics but also for safety reasons; doors should not slam too hard nor should they be difficult to open. It would also be wonderful to have stops placed on the doors of the school so that they need not be held open with rocks or bricks. This will be an expensive project to undertake.

SCHOOL HALLWAY FLOOORS

The hallways in the school provide a first glimpse of the condition of the school when new parents come for a visit. It is one of the few areas of the school building that is used by every student, every teacher, every staff person, and every visitor. It is extremely important in the impression that people have of our school and facility. The floors in our main hallways are over 80 years old. In some places the tiles are cracked or missing. For safety and aesthetic reasons the current floor must be removed and a new floor put down. It is estimated that \$35,000 will cover the cost to address our school hallway floors.

BYRIDER HALL

Byrider is a wonderful facility used for everything from sporting events, gym classes, meetings, to food assistance. It is one of the places most often seen by visitors to the parish who bring their kids for sporting events or who come for area wide meetings. It is part of the face of the parish. Though the gym is in good condition the surrounding structure has two basic problems.

In 2010 we were blessed to be able to replace all the interior doors and the flooring in the bathrooms and more due to the generosity of the VanDevere Group's gift of a car. However, a concern is simply that not a lot of attention has been paid to the interior of the building in recent years and so wood work, floors, and painted surfaces still need attention.

Additionally, a new entrance way to our wonderful gymnasium is needed. A glass vestibule has been designed so that children can enter into the gymnasium without letting the cold air into the facility as well as providing additional security for our students and visitors. The vestibule will also serve as an area for students to wait in safety for pick-up. \$30,000 will allow us to replace the main hallway flooring as well cover the costs of adding the new vestibule entranceway.

BYRIDER WINDOWS

Windows are the eyes of a building and give it its character. Well-maintained windows give good impressions as well as provide safety and conservation of energy. Byrider Hall is one of the buildings most often visited by people from all over the diocese who are not members of the parish as well as being a place where our groups, particularly our children meet for activities, meetings, and clubs.

The lower windows of Byrider Hall are in terrible condition. Their single-pane construction and

deteriorated state cost a lot of money in unnecessary energy waste. Their condition also poses a security risk for the building. We were blessed to receive a generous grant in 2010 from The Lehner Family Foundation that allowed us to replace half of the lower windows. A gift of \$12,000 will allow us to replace the rest of these windows to maintain the safety, energy efficiency and integrity this parish deserves.



BYRIDER LOCKER ROOMS

Whenever we have overnight programming it usually requires the renting of facilities off of our premises. We are happy to report our youth programs are growing stronger every year and the need for programming for them increases. We have also been approached by the diocese to host an overnight retreat for those considering a priestly vocation. The Byrider locker rooms are in terrible condition. The showers are completely unusable. This greatly limits the possibility of having overnight retreats on our grounds adding to the expense of such activities since buses, meeting halls and sleeping quarters must be rented. Additionally, this deteriorated space is not ideal for our students as well as athletic visitors who use and view our lockers rooms.

The VanDevere Group graciously donated a car to our school for a fund raising raffle in 2010. The funds generated from this endeavor allowed us to replace the appalling flooring in the locker rooms, bathrooms as well as locker room hallway with NatureStone, install new doors, new stadium lockers in the Boys Locker Room, and much more. Additional gifts totaling \$15,000 for the locker rooms will allow us to finish the much needed work which includes installing new sinks and toilets, lockers in the girls' locker rooms, painting of the walls and many more items to help update the facility.




