Jim	Altar Servers Maria has taken a survey of servers/parents related to changing daily Mass from 8am to 7:30am: I took a poll of the serving families and asked their input on the proposed time. First, the stats. We have 51 current servers. Of these 10 are homeschoolers and most of the weekend-only servers are highschoolers. We have 22 servers available for weekdays. Of those 22, 7 are non-day school members (homeschooled/Chesterton academy): Four Coulter boys, two Johnsons and Eddie McCausland. 19 people replied to a poll on the new time. 1 said that he would begin serving at 7:30 and doesn't currently serve at 8. 2 said they will not serve the 7:30, but do currently serve the 8. The rest said they will either like the 7:30 time better, or don't have a preference. (Evenly split 8 and 8) 17 replied on sub requests. 7/17 said they would likely volunteer to cover a sub request at the new time. 11/17 said they would not.

As a summary, I think it would help the day school on paper. There would be four more people available who are day school students and currently serve weekends only. Practically, I don't know how many would take you up on the offer because old habits die hard. I think those who already volunteer will continue to volunteer. Those who sub will continue to sub.
